Grade 10

- ❖ Start/Continue volunteering
- ❖ Create a Scholarship Resume (template on the FNSS Scholarship website)

Grade 11

- ❖ Start/Continue volunteering
- ❖ Signup for different scholarship accounts (see list on the FNSS Scholarship website)
- ❖ Check into affiliations, disability associations, employers and banks who offer scholarships
- ❖ Add to your Scholarship Resume
- ❖ Start writing your Personal Statement/Scholarship Essay
- ❖ Check out the SD#81 Guide to Scholarships and Bursaries
- ❖ Think about who should be your SD#81 and Non SD#81 references
- ❖ Start researching external scholarships you may be eligible for

Grade 12

- ❖ Research more external scholarships and be sure to check deadline dates
- ❖ Check and keep checking the FNSS Scholarship website for updates
- ❖ Continue checking into affiliations, disability associations, employers and banks who offer scholarships
- ❖ Update your Scholarship Resume
- ❖ Review again and edit your Personal Statement/Scholarship Essay again
- ❖ Order Official Transcripts using the BC Government [Order Transcripts and Certificates](#) website.
 - You will have to register for a Basic BCeid. It requires your PEN in order to do this.
 - You can get your PEN from Mrs. Martin or Mrs. Lindsey in the office
- ❖ March - Attend one of the SD#81 Scholarship Guide meetings
- ❖ Request letters of reference
- ❖ Have someone proofread your entire scholarship application
- ❖ Apply for scholarships before the deadline
- ❖ Keep a copy and record of the scholarship you are applying for (local and external)
- ❖ Create a Scholarship Portfolio / Binder
 - Reference Letters
 - Scholarship Resume
 - Transcripts
 - Essay/Personal Statement
 - Copies of local and external scholarships you have applied for
