To graduating students, parents and guardians:

The School District #81 Guide to Scholarships and Bursaries provides information on a variety of sources of financial awards for students in our School District who are entering post-secondary institutions: colleges, universities, and trade institutes. While it contains much of what is available from our community, it is not possible to list the scholarships, bursaries and awards which come from private donors, foundations, industries, associations, organizations, and government agencies.

Students should check with their employers, parents' employers, coaches, and associations for pertinent awards information. They should research financial assistance & programs on the websites of the post-secondary institution they plan to attend.

The content of the handbook is subject to change. To keep the information as complete and current as possible, students and teachers are asked to help by providing any scholarship, bursary, or award information that they receive to the School District Scholarship Coordinator. If you or your business would like to start an award, please also contact the Scholarship Coordinator.

Students in serious financial need should inquire about student loans, tuition assistance, bursary funds, and work-study programs. The website of each individual post-secondary institution has complete information. Students should contact their post-secondary institution of choice for specific information and in particular, ask about entrance awards.

Apply for as many scholarships as possible, but choose the scholarships and bursaries for which you are realistically eligible. Be prepared to spend time and effort; successful scholarship applications are the result of care, good supporting documents, and attention to detail. Remember that scholarships are won in competition with other students.

Students must have a valid Canadian Social Insurance Number for income tax purposes. Awards in excess of \$500 are considered taxable by Revenue Canada. Applications for a Social Insurance Number may be made in person at any Service Canada Centre or on line at [Social Insurance Number Application \(SIN\) - Government of Canada](#).

Students, I wish you luck. Please use the checklist at the end of the guide to make sure you meet all of the criteria.

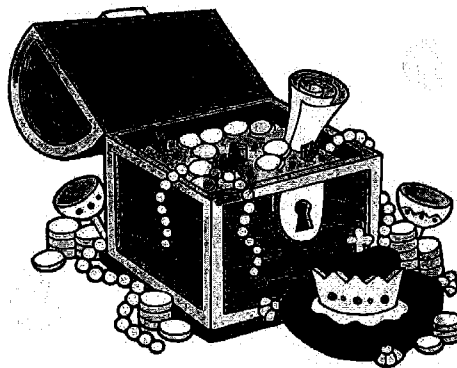

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SECTION 2- SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

An Overview

There are two main categories of awards offered to the students of School District #81. They are:

A. School District #81 Scholarships and Bursaries

B. District/Authority Awards

Awarded to students who demonstrate excellence and outstanding achievement in any of the following areas.

- **(APLSK) Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies** (e.g., Business, Technology, Home Economics, Media Arts, Tourism)
- **(COMSERV) Community Service (Volunteer Activity)**, which includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
- **(FINE) Fine Arts** (e.g., Dance, Drama, Music, Visual Arts)
- **(INDLC) Indigenous Languages and Culture**, demonstrated at school or in the community
- **(LNG) Languages from the Languages Curriculum or External Assessments**, including AP and IB courses
- **(PHYSAC) Physical Activity (and Health)** (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics)
- **(TRADES) Technical and Trades Training** (e.g., Coding, Culinary Arts, Mechanics, Robotics, Woodwork)

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A. SCHOOL DISTRICT #81 SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Eligibility

To be eligible applicants must meet all graduation requirements, as outlined by the Ministry of Education. The student must be registered as a student at FNSS or Toad River School, and must not have previously graduated in another province, or received a Dogwood in B.C. In addition, it is the requirement of some awards that the recipient is a Canadian Citizen.

I Scholarship Selected by the Donor

For these awards, students follow the application package expectations as outlined on pages 6-10. Upload your application packages by the deadline. The applications will then be forwarded to the donor for their review. The recipients of these awards are selected by the donor based on their individual criteria. Be sure to check what the donor requires for attachments if any.

II Scholarships Selected by the School District #81 Selection Committee

For these awards, students follow the application package expectations as outlined on pages 6-10. Upload your application packages by the deadline. Copies of the applicants will then be forwarded to the selection committee for their review. The recipients of these awards are chosen by the selection committee.

Selection Committee

The selection committee for these awards will include representation from

- School Board Office
- School District Administration
- FNSS Administration
- FNSS non grade 12 parent
- FNSS teacher
- School District Scholarship Coordinator.

The selection meeting takes place in June, based on term three marks. If there are significant changes to marks (i.e., failing final grades) changes may be made.

Recipients will receive a letter outlining how to redeem or receive their scholarship during the graduation ceremonies. **Keep the letter you receive at the graduation ceremonies.**

- References should not be family members.
 - One must be an SD 81 Employee and the other must be a non SD 81 employee who lives in the community.

3) Letters of Reference

- All awards require two letters of reference or recommendation:
 1. One from a School District #81 Employee
 2. One from a Local Community Member (**cannot** be an SD #81 employee).
- Letters of reference often form an important part of a donor's or the committee's decision. It is important, therefore, to give careful consideration to your choice.
- Choose people who are familiar with your achievements in school, athletics, student government, community service, employment, and other extracurricular activities.
- **School District Employee** – ask adults who know you well: teachers, education assistants, vice-principals, and principals.
- **Community Members** - ask adults who live in the community and know you well, but **who are not members of your family or SD #81 employees**: coaches, employers, ministers, and neighbours are all possibilities.
- Be sure to tell your referees specifically what you need and give them plenty of time because writing a good letter of reference requires time, effort, and thought.
- Ask the referee to use their respective letterhead if they have any.
- Fill out the form titled "About Me – a List of Ideas for Referees" detailing your experiences and skills. This form will give your referee essential information about you to use in a letter of reference. (See page 9 or **FNSS Scholarship Website- <https://www.sd81.bc.ca/fnss/scholarships/>**).

Commonly Asked Questions

How do I turn in my scholarship application package?

You will upload all documents, as PDFs, using the Google Form found on the [FNSS Scholarships Website](https://www.sd81.bc.ca/fnss/scholarships/) (<https://www.sd81.bc.ca/fnss/scholarships/>).

Are scholarships & bursaries only for students who plan to go to university?

There are many awards in this booklet for students going into trades and students who plan to attend post-secondary institutions other than universities.

Do you have to be an “A” student to win any awards?

While academic achievement is important for most, there is also a wide range of criteria listed for most of the awards.

What if I am taking a gap year, can I still apply?

Yes, but read the criteria for each award carefully, some awards allow for a gap year and others do not.

Scholarship and Bursary Redemption

When you win a scholarship you will be given a letter at grad explaining how to redeem the money. Some donors will give you the money at grad, while others give it at the outset of your first semester of post-secondary school, and still, others want to see you complete the first semester and be registered in the second semester. Donors determine when recipients receive their money. **This is why it is essential that you make other financial arrangements for your 1st semester of post-secondary school.**

1. Keep the letter you receive at the graduation ceremonies.
2. At the respective time email a copy of proof of enrollment & a transcript showing marks, along with your phone number, email address and current mailing address to:

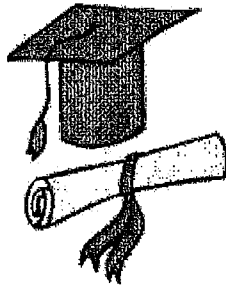

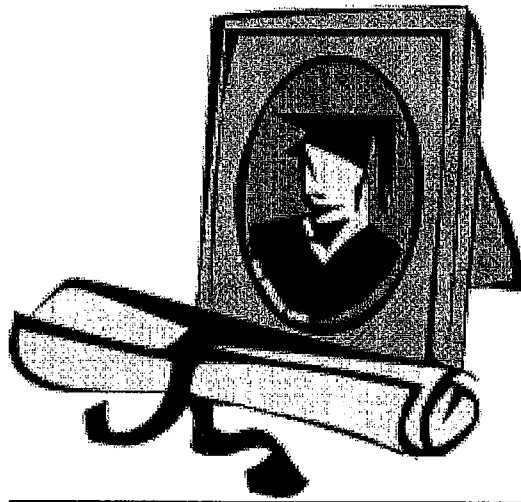

B. DISTRICT/AUTHORITY AWARDS

District/Authority Scholarships are given out by the BC Government. They recognize graduating BC students for excellence in a chosen area of interest or strength. Winners receive a \$1250 scholarship voucher to use towards post-secondary tuition. These awards are chosen by the SD #81 Scholarship Committee. It takes time to prepare a good portfolio, so an early start is always better.

Each year, the Ministry of Education allocates awards to each B.C. School District. The School District then rewards graduating students for their *excellent and outside achievement in any of the following non-academic fields*:

- **(APLSK) Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies** (e.g., Business, Technology, Home Economics, Media Arts, Tourism)
- **(COMSERV) Community Service (Volunteer Activity)**, which includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
- **(FINE) Fine Arts** (e.g., Dance, Drama, Music, Visual Arts)
- **(INDLC) Indigenous Languages and Culture**, demonstrated at school or in the community
- **(LNG) Languages from the Languages Curriculum or External Assessments**, including AP and IB courses
- **(PHYSAC) Physical Activity (and Health)** (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics)
- **(TRADES) Technical and Trades Training** (e.g., Coding, Culinary Arts, Mechanics, Robotics, Woodwork)

Basic Eligibility Requirements:

In order to be eligible to compete for a District/Authority Award, a student must:

- be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant)
- be a BC resident
- be enrolled at Fort Nelson Secondary School or Toad River School this school year and have fulfilled their graduation requirements
- be graduating in the same year the scholarship is awarded
 - Fulfill the B.C. graduation requirements of either the B.C. Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31 of their graduating year
- create a portfolio to showcase their achievement in their chosen area
- meet the criteria of the SD#81 Scholarship Selection Committee
- have exhibited good citizenship, contributing positively to both our school and community
- have not previously received a District/Authority Award or a District/Authority Scholarship

How to apply for a District/Authority Award:

In order to win a District/Authority Award, a student must:

- meet the above Basic Eligibility Requirements
- display **superior achievement** in a non-academic area,
- meet school standards in attendance, punctuality, behaviour, and attitude
- **apply to the School District #81 Scholarship Committee, uploading:**
 - **a personal essay/scholarship letter**
 - **a portfolio** of work completed over the course of the school year; this portfolio should provide an indication of work and experiences related to future plans.

Notes on portfolio preparation:

Your **portfolio** must show work completed over the course of the school year; this portfolio should provide an indication of in school and out of school work/ experiences/ projects/activities, as well as experiences related to your future plans.

Portfolios must be prepared digitally, in an uploadable format that can be opened on any device.

Redeeming a District/Authority Award

In November of 2025, the Ministry of Education will send you an envelope containing a letter, a certificate, and a voucher valued at one thousand two hundred and fifty (\$1250) dollars. To receive the monies from this voucher it is necessary for you to:

- Enrol with a post-secondary institution that is designated by the Province of B.C. (i.e., approved for Canada Student Loans), or a post-secondary program provider that is approved by SkilledTradesBC.
- Confirm the information on the voucher is correct.
- Have your voucher validated, on the back, by the Registrar's office of the post-secondary institution you are registered in and attending, and **return the completed voucher to the Ministry of Education for processing before its expiry date.** You have 5 years to redeem the voucher.

Note: The mailing instructions are indicated on the front of the voucher. We recommend that you (the student) mail the voucher to the address provided rather than leave it with the post secondary institution. **If your address has changed from that printed on the voucher, please provide your current mailing address.** Please allow six to eight weeks for completion of the redemption process.
